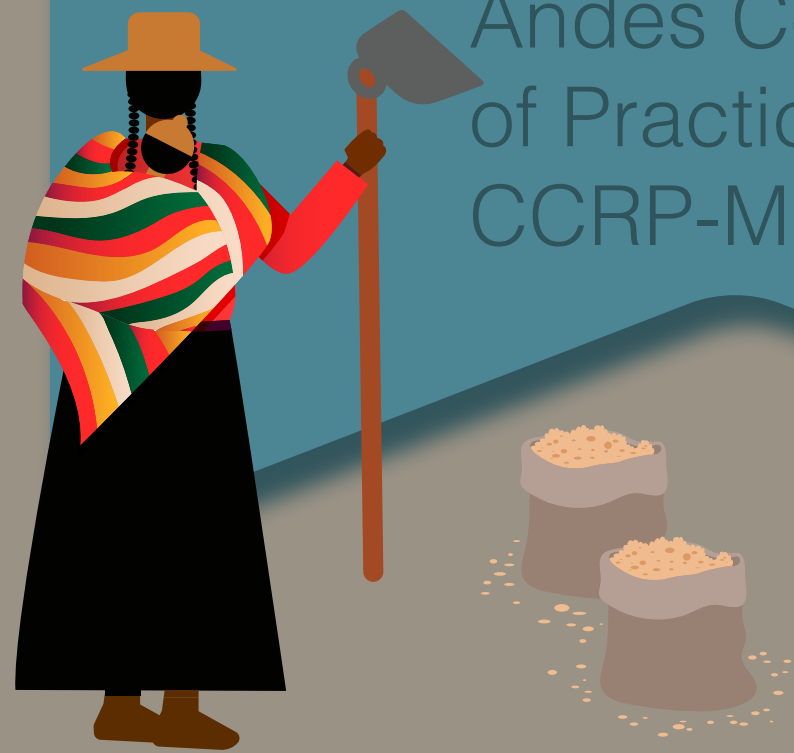

## Current situation:

- Migration and increased fragmentation of rural population
- Growing importance non-agrarian sources of family income
- Weakened flow of knowledge
- Great agroecological tradition
- Public sector still does not use agroecology as an alternative for development
- Ideology does not always match evidence
- Responding to a changing and complex world requires continuous research and learning

## Pathways to change:

- Support people and institutions to undertake agroecological research-action (diverse actors, farmer-focused, transdisciplinary) at local, regional, and global levels.
- Agriculture management options by contexts

## Expected change:

Regenerative, sustainable, and just agroalimentary systems in the Andean mountains and beyond.
